

LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

TEACHER EXPECTATIONS

A teacher will log on to their Zoom meeting and film videos in safe, controlled environments. These may include in offices or specialised facilities.

Teachers will be available online from 9 am to 3 pm. We will be creating lessons and resources, marking work, giving feedback and setting tasks for your child during this time. Unless a teacher is unwell or on other leave (in which case your child will be notified), we will:

- log on as per our timetable for a Zoom meeting
- conduct the Zoom meeting in a controlled, safe environment
- manage small Zoom meetings for groups of students who require extra support
- manage student behaviour during that meeting according to our existing processes

...to better support your child's learning.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

Students must check Google Classroom each day. Downloading the app can help them be notified of new tasks.

Students will often be invited by teachers to view videos, listen to podcasts and keep journals. Giving your child a range of activities that build their skills and knowledge improves their engagement – and when done well it may not look like our traditional expectations of learning!

Online learning will sometimes seem strange to families, but the behavioural expectations of the classroom still remain. Families should remember:

- Students must complete preparatory activities when the teacher sets these as 'due' before the Zoom meeting. This includes pre-reading, question-and-answer activities and some group tasks.
- Students must log on during their scheduled Zoom times.
 - If there is a reason for not logging on, the teacher may be able to provide a filmed version of this meeting for student catch up. However, it is very important for your child's wellbeing that they keep to a regular schedule, as this helps students stay calm and predict their days.
- Students should dress appropriately for online learning. While they will not be filmed, this is an important child protection measure.
- When students are working, the learning environment must be free of distractions:



Phones are away!



Television and screens off!



Sounds muted!

- Students must only access Zoom meetings from a **shared place in the home**. This is a critical student wellbeing requirement.
 - Parents and caregivers may view Zoom meetings! However, if you wish to ask clarifying questions or talk to teachers this must occur using the communication expectations outlined on the next page. It is inappropriate to interrupt these sessions as all students are learning and your child's teacher is a professional.
- Students should be muted during classes, however teachers may invite students to collaborate by talking. When talking, students should use headphones to protect the sound quality for all attending students.

ONLINE ENGAGEMENT SUPPORT

Online study can create difficulties for students in engaging with learning. Teachers will be supported to provide accessible and engaging online teaching and learning programs linked to the relevant achievement or performance standards (see the section 'Supporting your students' for more information on this).

Line managers and senior leaders will regularly check Google Classroom to support teachers in uploading:

- weekly outlines of instructions;
- weekly updates of resources, articles, website links shared with students;
- regular feedback on student work.


They will also check Daymap to ensure:

- class Zoom attendance is marked and updated as students complete tasks;
- parents are notified of missed Zoom classes via a text;
- well-being communications are made.

This supports your child to engage with the curriculum at their own pace!


CONTACTING TEACHERS

Students and families should contact teachers through one of three simple processes:




Google Classroom

On activities, students can ask clarifying questions.



Daymap

If students or parents have more questions, they can send Daymap messages to teachers.



Phone

If parents ring the school and leave a message for teachers, the teacher can contact them via Daymap with a ZOOM meeting time.

YEAR LEVEL COORDINATOR SUPPORT

Online learning is going to be a new challenge for everyone. During this time if you need school support please contact the relevant year level coordinator during normal schools times and they will try their best to assist you.

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
